#### A Meditation

In 2009, the late Francis Buxton, a parishioner and lay Benedictine, wrote a little booklet of meditations as part of his Lenten observance that year, which he shared with some of us.

In his preface, he wrote: 'After reading a passage of scripture slowly and prayerfully several times, I find that a few words, a phrase or sentence will stand out. This I regard as the Lord speaking to me for today. After considering the words and their relevance to my life or way of thinking, I make some reply. These sometimes take the form of poems in blank verse, like those that follow.

Until I am granted the gift of contemplation, this and prayer in other forms, is the total of my dialogue with the Lord.

If, as is your right, you do not agree with my responses, why not consider how you might have responded to the scrap of scripture – or, better still, choose one of your own.'

The following is an extract from that little booklet.

At home with the Lord: 2 Cor 5:8 Lord, hear us, in our body's home, With our understanding clouded, With suffering and tribulation, With choking, world-pollution reek.

In February, the parish suffered the shock of Fr. Brendan's sudden illness, from which he is still recuperating. We welcomed Fr. Jay to the parish in early March and happily he was formally installed as our Parish Priest by Bishop Alan on 25th October 2022.

Two parish open meetings were held in May and October and other parish activities have included the introduction of Youth Chess, Tennis and Table Tennis, as well as the recommencement of the monthly SVP Coffee Morning on the first Wednesday and monthly Afternoon Tea on the second Monday.

Two very good scripture study courses also took place during the year, led by Rachel and Kevin Pugh.

Sadly, the parish UCM group is reluctantly being wound up due to insufficient membership numbers and held its last meeting in December. We are grateful to all the members for their valuable contribution to the life of the parish over many years.
