GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



Branching Out - There's a lot of work to do in today's world. Almost daily, the TV and Radio brings terrible news of atrocities and disasters around the planet. It's easy to feel overwhelmed by all the bad news and to feel powerless to do anything. We do not consider that we can individually instigate change for lots of reasons. We do not feel clever enough, or brave enough or rich enough. In short, it's hard to know where to begin and even whether change is

possible. The inspirational message in today's gospel is that we can make changes as long as we work together.

We are already familiar with the ethos of trade unions. Trade unions operate on one powerful principal. Individually we can be easily overlooked but together we have the power to sway governments. If a trade union wanted to promote solidarity and unity, the vine would make an ideal logo. The vine itself is the heart of the union, the part that determines the ethos. The branches do the work of the vine and the fruit they bear is the outcome the final result.

Today we are told that with Christ as our vine we can do great things. All too often we become wrapped up in developing our own spirituality, trying to work out what God means to us as an individual, striving to find our niche. It's easy to forget that we are part of a huge family of people the biggest union on the planet. With Christ's teaching and pruning, we as a body, have the ability to transform the world by putting faith into action. Our individual responsibility is to look for ways in which we can become part of the overall plan. We don't have to branch out alone; we branch out as a team.

Mid-Norfolk Foodbank – The latest newsletter from the Mid-Norfolk Foodbank shows that in the last year, the number of people helped was 4,000; the number of children helped was 1,500; the weight of food donated amounted to 62,800 kg; the weight of food handed out was 49,600 kg and the number of meals 110,000. A feature of the last year has been the number of other organisations who were helping people with food donations and the Foodbank was able to supply a number of these with food equivalent to a further 14500 meals. There was amazing support from the whole mid Norfolk community. From grants from local councils and bulk donations of food from local supermarkets, to a large number of money donations from individuals who were unable to get out to buy food for us. In all over the year the Foodbank had food donations from 140 donor organisations and many individuals.

Praying the Rosary in May - The Holy Father has selected Shrines from across the world to participate in his special initiative to pray the Rosary during the month of May for the end of the pandemic. He himself will initiate this on May 1st and end it on May 31st. The Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham was selected to participate on May 1st at 5.00pm, to be live streamed from Walsingham to the Vatican television Centre so that Pope Francis could see it live. Our particular Intention is for those who have died from the pandemic across the world.
