GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE EPIPHANY



Follow That Star! - It's the Epiphany, and traditionally the time of year to pack Christmas back into the attic. Today the three wise men set us a shining example. Yes it's time to put the tinsel away, but how can we keep the Christmas star alive?

The wise men in the Epiphany gospel were visionaries with a star that they were determined to follow whatever the obstacles. It's a romantic notion, but visionaries are more than just romantic dreamers. Visionaries are men and woman who can visualise and map the future. More than this, visionaries can realise a better future by their conviction and focus. The wise men began their quest with a hunger for the truth and a determination to find

answers. When they finally found Jesus lying in a lowly stable they came away happier and wiser men as a result. Following the star rewarded the three wise men for their focus, by giving their lives better meaning and purpose. Following their star helped the Magi to be the people God had meant them to be.

So how do we follow our star? Firstly we have to have a vision. What does God want of us? Some people agonise over this question, but for many of us it's simply a case of looking at our talents and using them to make the world a better place. Having a vision is all well and good, but next we have to make plans and put those plans into action. This might involve sitting down and identifying obstacles. Remember that obstacles aren't always put in our way by other people. More often or not obstacles exist in our own minds and in our own character traits. As we travel towards our goal we have to determine in whom and in what we trust. When things get tough, it is easy to listen to a well-meaning friend encouraging us to take an easy way out, or adopt a more comfortable goal. "King Herods" don't always come in the obvious guise of a pantomime baddie. Lastly, we have to be able to recognise Jesus in our lives, and once we have found him, allow him to navigate.

For all those who are heading into the new year feeling lost, or tired, or lonely, or disillusioned, remember that good things await those who listen to God, and follow his star.

Message from Bishop Alan Hopes – **Walsingham** - "I know that you will be very pleased to hear that the Holy Father, Pope Francis, has granted by a special decree the title of Minor Basilica to the national Shrine of Our Lady in Walsingham. It includes the Slipper Chapel, the Chapel of Reconciliation and the domain. The decree was dated December 27th, on the Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph - such an appropriate day for England's Nazareth! The Holy See's recognition of the importance of the church in Walsingham is a recognition of the growth and witness of the Shrine over

these many years since it's re-establishment after the Reformation, for its constant witness to the importance of marriage and family life, and its pastoral care of the tens of thousands of pilgrims who make their journey to the shrine every year. I am quite sure that this moment will bring many blessings and graces to all pilgrims in the coming years. I would especially urge you during this coming year, which is both the Jubilee Year of Mercy and the fortieth anniversary of the erection of our Diocese in 1976, to join together in thanksgiving at the Diocesan Pilgrimage on May 2nd. May Our Lady of Walsingham pray for us all!"

Jubilee Year of Mercy - How can we show others the mercy of God? We say that God is compassionate, but do we show compassion for the poor? We say that God loves us and has mercy on us, but do we hang on to grudges or stand in judgement over others? In this, the Jubilee Year of Mercy, our actions need to authentically reflect God's mercy.

Christmas Card Recycling - The Woodland Trust is calling on the UK to recycle its Christmas cards for the fifth year running. The Marks and Spencer Christmas Card Recycling Scheme is now in its fifth year, and the UK is 32,000 trees richer thanks to the public's efforts in dropping cards in to store each January, rather than distributing in kerbside recycling bins. Last year 6,255,833 cards were collected through the M&S Christmas Card Recycling Scheme, enabling the Woodland Trust to plant 6,256 trees throughout the UK. The popularity of the scheme means it will run again this year. Special card collection bins will be in M&S stores from 2nd January to 31st January 2016.
