

GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Greater Point



When we read about Jesus' miracles, two big questions spring to mind. Does Jesus still cure people today? And ... why does Jesus cure some people but not others? Surely with his power he could cure everybody! Jesus behaves unexpectedly in today's gospel. Having cured Simon's mother in law, the whole town turns up at his door eager for miracle cures, and Jesus obliges. This it would seem is his golden opportunity. This is his

chance to have everybody eating out of the palm of his hand. Instead, Jesus gets up early and goes off to a deserted place, and when Simon comes looking for him, Jesus suggests that instead of returning to his newfound fans, that they move on to the next village. This might seem odd to many, but it is to become apparent that curing the sick was not top of Jesus' agenda.

Healing was only part of Jesus' primary ministry to teach. Jesus' healing miracles were signs of his identity and of God's power and compassion. His acts of healing were often to teach the importance of faith and discipleship.

Does Jesus still cure today? Perhaps the question is irrelevant. In asking it, are we missing the greater point? As mere mortals, our health is of paramount importance to us, but is it top of God's agenda? Saint Bernadette made a prayer that we could do well to adopt. She said "Lord, I do not ask that I never be afflicted, but only that you never abandon me in affliction."

Foundation Masses - We currently have 25 foundation Mass each year. These yield a stipend of £3.00 each which is credited to our Diocesan Account each year as £75.00. All of the Foundation Masses at Sacred Heart are fairly recently established and we do not have any going back into the 'mists of time'. The Diocese has asked me to explain that as long as there is some income generated from Foundation Masses, then the Masses will be celebrated but where there is no income then the Mass intentions may be grouped together or celebrated *ex caritate*, i.e. without a stipend. We are not at that stage, but it may happen in the not too distant future.

Celebration of Our Lady of Lourdes, 17th February – The annual Diocesan celebration of Our Lady of Lourdes will be taking place on Saturday, 17h February at the Cathedral of St John the Baptist, Norwich. Solemn Mass at 11.30 a.m. with Anointing of the Sick.

Open Parish Meeting - It is on the horizon, but no date will be fixed until the next Finance Committee meeting when the accounts will be signed off and returned to the Diocese. Would Group and Committee leaders and all who made a Report to the Parish, please do so again this year. I sent a copy of last year’s report to Bishop Alan and he replied that he was delighted to see how vibrant we are here.
