GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT



Making the Right Choices - The trouble with the devil is that we don't always recognise him. If temptation gave us obviously poor choices we would easily resist, but the biggest problem with temptation is that it finds us at our most vulnerable and presents us with seemingly attractive choices. It sounds obvious that we should make good choices over sinful ones, yet we are extraordinarily good at justifying poor decisions. "Having a fling with the person in the next offices is okay," a cheating partner

might remark, "as long as no one gets hurt." "Working on the side and claiming benefits is okay," reasons the benefit fraud, "I'm not exactly raking it in, and in any case, everyone else seems to be doing it." We are good at making the wrong decision in the face of temptation and finding ways to justify our choices. At the root of most temptation is an option for us to take the easy way out. To make the right choices often involves discomfort, hard work, sacrifice and will power. Often making the right decision seems beyond us.

Lent is a time for us to grapple with the temptations in our own lives. Lent is a time for us to get to know ourselves better. A helpful exercise is to use our imaginations to picture the sort of people we would like to become. Few of us would picture ourselves as weak or incapable of making good decisions. Picturing ourselves making good decisions is a healthy start... all we need now is the will power to put our lives on the right track. That's where Jesus steps in. In today's gospel, Jesus models how to behave in the face of temptation. Jesus shows us that compromise can play no part in our purpose. During Lent we pray to Jesus for help in overcoming temptation and becoming the people we want to be.

PARISH PRAYER - Father, pour out your Spirit upon our parish. Grant us a new vision of your glory, a new faithfulness to your Word, and a new consecration to your service; that your love might grow among us and your Kingdom come.

News from our Rome Correspondent: "Things continue to move apace here in Rome, with the second semester of the second year underway as of today. Following the frenetic examinations week, we had a few days' break followed by an intense silent retreat in-house at the college, and now we return to our normal routine and lectures and essays begin again. The weather here in Rome is mild – although there is a nip in the air, the sun is bright, and it's more like a crisp Spring day than the middle of Winter. Lent is just around the corner, of course, and for those people with the energy and determination, there will be a programme of stations masses at many of the betterknown churches in the city taking place early in the mornings (a 5.30 am start is necessary to get to the mass on time and then be back at the college for breakfast and lectures, so it's a brave man who does this on a regular basis!). In March the students in my year hope to receive the ministry of acolyte: instituted acolytes have privileges and responsibilities in the serving of mass and as Eucharistic ministers within the Church community, and this is an important milestone within our overall formation. Approaching this stage in our discernment reminds me how quickly the time here in Rome is passing, and how what once seemed very remote and far-off in the future is becoming very near: before this calendar year is out, we will have to decide whether to make a formal application for candidacy for holy orders, and will have this application confirmed or deferred by the Church, after which ordination to the diaconate and to the priesthood can follow. Discernment does not end when we are accepted for seminary, but continues through the years, and time is very relative here, slow day-by-day, fast month-by-month, and so I'm already approaching the halfway mark of my expected stay in Rome. Where do the years go? Please accept my prayers and good wishes, and may Lent and Easter be a time of great blessings for you and everyone you love. Regards, Mike Brookes".
