I FEAR YOU'VE BEEN TAKEN-IN

There were some good things about Holy Week and Easter (apart from the poor attendances at the important Liturgies on Maundy Thursday and Holy Saturday) but one thing that causes me particular concern is the very small number of people who made their Confession before Easter this year. Far fewer than ever before. Someone suggested that my personal lack of competence in the Confessional has led people to go elsewhere. I can't help but agree with the first part of that suggestion, but I'm dubious about the truth of the second. I know that a few people do go elsewhere for Confession, which is fine, but I suspect that the number is very small. Most of you, I suspect just haven't bothered.

What has gone wrong? Clearly the Enemy has been getting at you. Of course I don't know what insidious suggestions he's made, what lies he's told you. But I can hazard some guesses. Maybe he's told you that sin doesn't really matter. But of course it does. Our sin, our disobedience, creates a blockage between us and God, and more particularly a blockage in the channels of grace. Only God's forgiveness can remove that blockage, and so restore the clear passage of grace into our hearts.

Maybe he's told you that forgiveness is available – much more comfortably – without going to Confession. If that is the case, then why did Jesus institute this Sacrament , on the first Easter night, when he said to his Apostles – the fountainhead of the ordained ministry of the Church – 'whosoever sins you forgive will be forgiven'? Confession is Jesus' way of giving us forgiveness, so there cannot be a better way.

Maybe he's told you that you've not really done anything wrong, that only if you'd commited rape or murder or whatever would you need to go to Confession. Don't be taken in. All sin damages our relationship with God, and the Church urges us to confess venial as well as mortal sins. Do you really think that you are without sin? St.John says that the person who thinks that he is sinless simply deceives himself.

Maybe he's told you that you are too busy to go to Confession, that you've got better things to do. Then ask yourself what things are more important than the things of God, including your own sanctification and salvation. Too busy for God? Too busy to receive a precious gift that he wants to give to you? We need to apprehend what things really matter.

Maybe he's tried one of those old chestnuts such as 'the priest might tell someone', or 'the priest might think the worse of me', or 'the priest might be shocked at what I'm really like'. Rubbish. The priest is bound to complete secrecy, he never thinks the worse of a penitent – he's a penitent himself – and he's pretty unshockable. He's heard it all before, sadly, many many times.

Yes, I don't of course know what particular line the devil has taken with you. But he's clearly had a field day in the parish. If he's stopped you coming to Confession, his next move will be to tell you it's not worth coming to Mass. Once we stop going to Confession, we are on a slippery slope. Act now. Stop listening to him. Say with Our Lord 'begone, Satan'. And then know once more the joy of sin forgiven, in the particular way that God, in his infinite love, has given to us.
