LOOKING FORWARD.....

In two weeks time I'll be off on my annual holiday – I always go at the end of September/ early October because then the weather tends to be a little more reliable, places are quieter when the schools have gone back, and also the Autumn is a lovely time in the countryside, with a certain

mellowness which is infinitely attractive. I'm finding, though, that thoughts of my holiday are filling – even dominating - my thinking increasingly: a great looking-forwards, a counting of the days. But then looking forwards seems to play quite a part in the lives of all of us, don't you think? Arn't there things which you are looking forward to at present? Seeing your family, resolving a problem, obtaining something you want very much, going somewhere special? And indeed looking forward seems to be an authentic part of the Christian life. Ultimately, of course, we are looking forward to the establishment of the Kingdom, to new life in Christ in all its fullness, to the completion of salvation, and yes, as the climax of all of our looking forward, the Vision of God, which is our final end and hope.

But I feel just a little uneasy about my excessive looking forward to my holiday. My Mother, I seem to remember, used to warn about 'wishing your life away', and too much looking forward can surely result in a failure to value and use the present moment. Because savouring, using, living-out the present moment is also an authentic element in the Christian understanding. Each moment is precious, and the present is full of opportunities to know and love God, and to celebrate and serve our neighbour. Each moment is an opportunity which will not return, and whilst the future to which we look forward may or may not materialize, the present moment is absolutely real.

So maybe there has to be a kind of tension between this looking forward with eager anticipation and using and enjoying to the full what God has given us here and now. Both things are natural and proper, and there is perhaps a kind of healthiness in holding the two in tandem. Without looking forward there would be a lack of perspective and breadth in our lives, and yet we must live out our present moment enthusiastically if we are to make the most of our lives. In Our Lord's incarnate life and teaching we see this tension between future and present in its perfection. He certainly looked forward to the new resurrection life which he would share with his redeemed people, but likewise he used every moment and opportunity to proclaim the Truth and to manifest the abundant love of God.
