

## GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE 28<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



### Golden Opportunities

Remember the story of King Midas? He was invited to make a wish, and he wished that everything he touched be turned to gold. At first the king had a whale of a time turning pots, vases, and simple household utensils into valuable objects. It didn't take him long however to work out that his love of gold was about to destroy everything most precious to him, as he turned food, butterflies and finally his beloved daughter into solid lumps of metal.

In many ways we are just as foolish as Midas. How many people do you know who won't go anywhere unless it's safe to park their brand new car? How many of us watch the aid agency adverts and sympathise, yet decide we can't part with any cash right now? How many of us cannot get up and get involved in worthy causes because our work commitments come first? We are just the same as Midas. Our material concerns stand in the way of what is really important.

The man in today's gospel story was not a bad man; he had kept all God's commandments. This makes the story all the sadder, that he couldn't follow Jesus because of the one thing that stood in his way, his wealth. The man turned away, because he had much wealth and couldn't let go.

Today's gospel invites the question, 'Do we own our possessions, or do our possessions own us?' Have we figured out what we could do with our lives that would be really worthwhile, and what is it that stands in our way? What golden opportunities does God put our way, and have we made space in our lives to rise to God's challenges. The material things in our lives lure us with promises of security and comfort, but those are not the things we will be remembered for, we will be remembered for the differences we make in other people's lives. That is the true wealth God promises us.
