GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Life's Highs and Lows



Today we find Peter James and John grappling with the news that Jesus is destined to be put to death in Jerusalem, and they become deeply demoralised. The disciples are picturing a future that is hopeless and they are left with feelings of helplessness and fear. To rid his disciples of these defeatist feelings, Jesus needs to replace their defeatist thoughts. Jesus replaces the defeatist thoughts with a motivational vision. When the disciples see Jesus transfigured with

dazzling light and God's voice booming from the clouds, it is to give them a glimpse of what is to come. This isn't about replacing reality with pretty thoughts; it's about pushing through a pain barrier and being able to see something better on the other side.

If we were to be honest we'd all love to have a motivational mountain top experience ... a glimpse of God to help us through our daily monotonous existence. We'd all love to see clear signs of God working in our lives. A little cynical voice tells us it isn't going to happen! Motivational experiences can happen unexpectedly, in any place and at any time, yet the truth is that most of us soldier on with no such experience. Could it be that we are simply not open to such an experience? Can we expect to hear from God if we are rarely thinking about him? Can we really expect God to change our lives if we are not open to change? Can we be guided by God if we don't believe we need guidance? Can we find motivation if we're not seeking it? Is it possible to see God's opportunities in our lives if we are not looking for opportunities? Can we catch a glimpse of God if we're not looking?

To change our lives, we first need to sit down and visualise how different life could be if we could only let God in. We need to visualise breaking through our pain barriers to create our own highs.
