THE BISHOP'S PLANS – AND OURS!

The Bishop has announced that he intends to celebrate Lenten Station Masses this year – one in each of the Deaneries. Our will be on Tuesday, March 11th (the first Tuesday in Lent) at Our Lady's church in King's Lynn. Before each of these Masses there will be a one-hour time of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, during which the priests of the Deanery will be available to hear Confessions. After the Mass, a simple Lenten supper of soup and rolls will be served, giving the Bishop an opportunity to meet the people of the Deanery.

I think that this is much to be welcomed, and I do hope that many of you will attend. Nearer the time I will put a notice up about car-sharing. I think that the opportunity to make one's confession at the beginning of Lent will be especially valuable.

However the date chosen makes a problem for us here on two fronts! The first is that the next Parish Pastoral Council was going to be held on that day. I suggest that we simply bring that meeting forward a week, to Tuesday, March 4th. Please will member of the PPC change the date in their diaries.

The second problem is that I had planned that we would hold the Lent Group to look at the Holy Father's teaching in his Apostolic Exhortation *THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL* on each of the Tuesdays in Lent (I'd overlooked the prearranged PPC date!) Tuesday really is the most convenient date for the Group to meet, and so I suggest that in the first week of Lent, when the Station Mass occurs, we meet on the Wednesday, but then revert to Tuesdays for the following four meetings. I do hope that these re-arrangements are acceptable.

THE LIGHT AND THE DARK

In the accounts of the terrible flooding which has taken place in various parts of the country, I wonder whether you've been struck by the contrast between the people who have been working tirelessly to help those affected by the crisis, and those who have used it as an opportunity for looting? We are full of admiration for those who have come to the help their neighbours in their distress, whilst we are utterly disgusted by those who have sought to profit from it. It almost seems as if these two sets of people, the one motivated by charity, and the other by greed, belong to two different races – such a world of difference is there between their differing reactions to this calamity which has affected so many people

But then when we look into our own hearts we find that there is both light and darkness there. We know that we can be extremely kind to people – that we can show great generosity and understanding. But we know, too, that we can be selfish, mean, and unforgiving. Some people, yes, seem to be predominantly bad, and some to be predominantly good. But all of us are ultimately a mixture of the two. We are, at the same time, both children of the light and children of the darkness. Our human nature is fallen, it has lost its original perfection. We are damaged. And yet much remains in us that is still of God, and this, hopefully in many, is being amplified by grace.

Pray God that when we see examples of goodness, of heroism, of generosity, it will give us an increasing love of the light, and a deeper desire to open our hearts to God's grace, so that little by little we may emerge totally from the darkness into the fullness of that joy which belongs to the light.

The Holy Father has recently raised our Metropolitan, the Archbishop of Westminster, to membership the College of Cardinals, a cause of pleasure to all English Catholics. Our bishop has asked that we should all pray for the new Cardinal this weekend, which we will do in the Prayer of the Faithful at each of the Masses.
