The 'I'm All Right Jack' Mentality - "Woe to those who are rich." "Woe to those with plenty to eat." "Woe to those who laugh." "Woe to those who are honoured." Does Jesus mean that heaven is denied us if we pick up a well-earned pay packet at the end of the month, stock the freezer and put on a cheerful face?

Few of us consider ourselves really well off, but there is a danger that when we are finally making ends meet, we can become seriously complacent. There is a real danger that when we are sitting down to our Spaghetti Bolognese and bottle of Italian red, that the images of world

disasters flashing across our TV screens do not really touch us for more than fleeting moments. We have struggled through a hard day at work, paid the bills, fed the family and got the children to bed. The last thing we want is breaking news of famine or earthquakes to make us feel uncomfortable.

"Blessed are those who are poor. Blessed are those who are hungry. Blessed are those who weep." Jesus is always on the side of those who are poor and badly done to, but is that a prescription for being poor and hungry in a bid to win Jesus' favour? Jesus is clearly not about keeping people in poverty, so what exactly does he mean?

In God's kingdom our earthly values are turned upside down. We count wealth, good health and success as blessings, which of course they are, but they stop being blessings and become hindrances instead when we bury our heads in the sand and fail to see or do anything about a world that suffers widespread starvation and war. **The Ordination to the Priesthood of The Revd. Michael Brookes.** There is some interest in going together as a group to the Cathedral. About 15 people have indicated their interest to me so far.

The Dowry of Mary Pilgrimage Triduum - During the course of 2018 to 2020 the statue of Our Lady from the Slipper Chapel at the Catholic National Shrine in Walsingham will be taken to each Cathedral in England for a three-day triduum of prayer, as part of the

preparation for the re-dedication of England as the Dowry of Mary in 2020. Each visit will take place between a Thursday and Saturday. The Tour will be coming to East Anglia from **28th February to 2nd March 2019 at St John's Cathedral, Norwich.** See the poster at the back of the church for more details. The Dowry Tour is a moment of great grace for this nation and particularly for East Anglia. Based on historical records, the Kingdom of East Anglia may have been the first kingdom to be dedicated as the Dowry of Mary by St. Edmund in the 9<sup>th</sup> century (martyred 869). Eventually this dedication spread to the nation of England but there are indications it began here and perhaps that was in preparation for Our Lady establishing her national shrine at Walsingham. Therefore, it is quite unique that Our Lady now visits her Cathedral in Norwich and is preparing to pour out many graces upon her children.

Racial Justice Sunday, 17th February – In Octogesima Adveniens and Gaudium et Spes, St Paul VI teaches that "all people have a right to work ... to lead a worthy life on the material, social, cultural and spiritual level". We are therefore called to ensure people are not exploited while they work, and to open our hearts to those who face this hatred. In our task as disciples of Christ, our responsibility is to make sure people are treated with dignity at work and are not exploited. Migrant communities and those suffering from racial abuse are particularly vulnerable to being drawn into unjust working conditions and labour exploitation.
