More Like Christ.

When we are children we don't believe that we will ever grow to be obese, passed our prime or out of condition; it's something that creeps up on us. The extra pounds that pile on around our waistlines are the result of making wrong choices on a daily basis. Just as we can become physically unfit so we can become spiritually unfit. When we are young we cannot imagine making wrong choices or poor decisions, but

compromise, apathy and temptation creeps up on the best of us. We become consumed by things that don't really matter. If we are not careful, God's values can fall by the wayside and we end up feeling weighed down, dissatisfied and unhappy.

On the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we are reminded that in just the same way as we care for our physical diet, so we need to take care of our spiritual diet. We need to make Jesus part of our spiritual diet both in communion and in our daily choices to live as Christians so that we might be spiritually whole. We are invited to feel alive and rejuvenated and ready to impact the world around us.

When we faithfully participate in the Eucharist, the sacrament has the power to influence us and change us; it joins each of us to Christ and hopefully, makes us more like him. Today's challenge is to think a little harder about what we are actually doing in participating in the Eucharist, and what we should expect as a result.

Day for Life: Sunday, 18 June 2017 – Each year Day for Life provides an opportunity to reflect on the dignity of every human person, both young and old, and to pray for and support all life from conception to natural death. This year's Day for Life provides us with an opportunity to reflect, to pray and to offer practical and emotional support, especially for those who have lost a child and for those women who are anxious about their pregnancy. As we approach the 50th anniversary of the Abortion Act in October, we mourn the large annual number of abortions and continue to pray for the care and support of mothers and their children in the womb. In his Angelus address on the Italian Day for Life in February this year, Pope Francis said to thousands gathered in St Peter's Square, "May no-one be left alone and may love defend the sense of life." Citing the words of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, he continued: "Life is beauty, admire it. Life is life, fight for it ... Each life is sacred. Let's pray together for those children who are in danger of interruption of pregnancy and for those who are nearing the end of life." These words can help us rediscover a spirit of awe towards the gift of human life and stir our hearts to the wonder of this gift. We are invited to support the crucial work of Day for Life by giving to the retiring collection today. This enables the Church to fund the Anscombe Bioethics Centre (formerly the Linacre Centre), as well as projects that seek to care for life at every stage and in every condition.
