Money Matters Last Sunday £461.31 was given at the Offertory, and a further £156.42 in the special collection for the Society for the Protection of the Unborn Child (SPUC). This Sunday is observed as Peace Sunday, and there is a retiring collection for *PAX CHRISTI*, the Catholic Peace Organization.

Red Missionary Boxes Donal Hannon writes 'When the red boxes were emptied recently, they were found to contain the sum of £729.0, which has now been banked. The emptying of the boxes earlier last year produced £616.0, and so the total giving within the past year amounts to £1345.0, which is an impressive amount.'

READ ANY GOOD BOOKS RECENTLY?

I've just finished reading two of the books which I was given for Christmas ; both very different, but both enjoyable, and to be recommended.

The first is outstanding : *ENCOUNTERS WITH GOD : IN QUEST OF THE ANCIENT ICONS OF MARY*, by Sister Wendy Beckett. I was delighted to have been given this, having been so impressed by the television programme about Sr. Wendy on Christmas Day. I do hope that you were able to see it. She is inspirational. This book is about her pilgrimage to view the eight ancient icons of Mary which survive from before the eighth-century, when the great destruction of icons took place in the Eastern Church. She writes with infectious enthusiasm, and great insight. She is one of those writers who have the extraordinary gift of writing just as they speak, so that you feel that they are addressing you face to face from the

page. It is a book which one can't put down, and I'm longing to re-read it.

The second book is lighter in weight, but also enjoyable *FAVOURITE CHRISTMAS CAROLS*, by Aled Jones. Aled too – a favourite himself with so many of us – has just that same ability to write as he speaks, and like Sister Wendy is entirely himself on the written page. And as with Sr. Wendy, his very pleasant, open, and generous personality comes across vividly. One feels better for having been in the company of both of these Christian writers. They, and what they write, are edifying.

Aled in his book takes thirty-two well-known carols, and writes about their origin and his own experience in performing them. It doesn't pretend to be a scholarly book, and one or two things don't quite add up. As, for example, when he tells us that the 'carol' (?) *The twelve days of Christmas* comes, perhaps, from the time when Catholics were under persecution, and were able to communicate their Faith secretly through this carol: but then he goes on to give a 'translation' in which the five gold rings, for example, represent the first five books of the Old Testament, the two turtle doves the Old and New Testaments, the seven swans a swimming the Seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, etc. Nothing very much in need of concealing from the Protestant establishment here, I would have thought I've always heard that the five gold rings were the five wounds of Christ, the two turtle doves the Two Natures of Christ (divine and human), and the seven swans, the seven Sacraments of the Church.) But this is a minor criticism of a book which is very good for light reading.

THE YEAR OF FAITH

Now that Christmas is well and truly over, a reminder that we are in the Year of Faith. One of the things that parishes are urged to do to mark it, is to study one of the documents of the Second Vatican Council, since in part this special Year is being held to mark the fiftieth anniversary of the opening of the Council. Our Parish Pastoral Council resolved that we should study the Constitution on the Church, *LUMEN GENTIUM*, during Lent. Copies are on order, and probably we will meet on Tuesday evenings.
