Success, Power and Wealth

If you took a survey out onto the street asking, "Which people would we regard as the most successful?", celebrities like Bill Gates or Simon Cowell might figure highly on the list. Favourite pop idols, film stars, politicians and royalty might be up there too. It seems that we measure success in terms of popularity, glamour, money and power. Even in our own not-so-famous circles, we strive for status and job promotion. With promotion comes extra responsibility and with that extra responsibility, increased power to our elbow.

The disciples may well have been feeling bemused in today's gospel story. Jesus tells them that man will hand him over to his death. The disciples were probably wondering why Jesus should succumb to this kind of ignominy. After all, wasn't he the Son of God? Couldn't he exercise some power? Who knows, perhaps it was this idea that prompted their conversation on the way to Capernaum. We are told that the disciples were discussing amongst each other, which of them was the greatest. They must have known deep down that Jesus would not approve of this discussion, because when Jesus asks them what they were talking about, they fall silent with shame.

Jesus places a small child in their midst to teach them a lesson. He is asking them, and us, to accept the child's world as our own. We are asked to accept a world of vulnerability and absence of status. We are asked to take stock. Who do we look up to in our society? Do we look down on those who appear to lack ambition or position? Today we remember that Jesus' way is not of pomp and circumstance, but of servitude and humility. We have to learn that success is not about what we have, but who we are.

IGNITE 2015, NORWICH – A Procession of Witness to celebrate *The New Evangelisation* in the Diocese of East Anglia will be taking place on **Friday, 2nd October, 2015**, led by Bishop Alan Hopes. The event begins at 12:00 noon with a Schools Mass at the Cathedral of St John the Baptist, Norwich. At 8:00pm there will be a torchlight procession of the Blessed Sacrament from the Castle Mound to the Cathedral of St John the Baptist, to which everyone is invited. From 9:30pm there will be an all-night vigil before the Blessed Sacrament, led by our parishes and young people. Again, everyone is welcome for all or part of the night. The vigil will end with Solemn Mass at the Cathedral at 11:30am. See the poster and cards at the back of Church.

Confirmation Preparation – Last May, over 300 people attended the main Diocesan Youth Event, *The Ignite Festival*, which was a great success with some young people finding it a life changing experience. Bishop Alan's expectation is that all Confirmation groups from across the Diocese will attend the 2016 Ignite Festival (April 30th – May 2nd) as part of their Confirmation Programme. For some groups this could be their preconfirmation retreat. The weekend brings together young people from across the Diocese to experience a powerful encounter with the Lord. There will be worship, speakers, live music, social time, workshops, adoration and prayer opportunities for confession. etc. More information will be available from the Diocesan Youth Mission Team in due course.

'Coming Home' Initiative – Five out of six baptised Catholics no longer come to Mass. Today's Home Mission Sunday marks an initiative around the Diocese to try and change that with every parish in the diocese being asked to include in their bidding prayers at Masses from now until the First Sunday of Advent the 'Coming Home' prayer for non-Church-going Catholics. There are prayer cards available at the back of church for you to take some to say the prayer at home and to give to friends and those sick or housebound members of the parish who are unable to come to Mass. We want our friends and family who don't come to Mass to know that we're praying for them and hope the cards might spark off a conversation about faith and going to Mass and why people do or don't attend.
