


GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE CHRIST THE KING



King of Mercy

Our lives are filled with such horrible instances of the abuse of power, that royal imagery seems out of place when talking about Jesus. But the reign of Jesus from the cross is based on a different vision of power altogether. Jesus' authority is nothing about oppression and everything about mercy. His is a power that never seeks to rule or dominate, but rather seeks to serve and lead by example. His is a power that never seeks to rule by causing conflict or division but a power that seeks to unify the world by

promoting understanding, tolerance, justice, sharing and peace. His is a kingdom in which we will all be valued and loved.

This week sees the close of Pope Francis's 'Year of Mercy'. It's apt that the year closes in a week where we consider Christ as a king not of power but of compassion and mercy. What must we learn from the year of mercy, and from the path Jesus chose? It's simple! We might see others as guilty or sinful. Jesus sees those same people as needy and vulnerable. If we have learnt anything this year it should be that there is worth in everyone we meet.

The vision of God's kingdom is a vision we can start living here on earth. We can begin realising it by challenging our own values, in how we treat others and how we respond to the world around us.

In today's gospel, we see a crown of thorns instead of a crown of jewels and a cross instead of a throne. It might seem a bit of a mystery to the non-believers who are governed by self-interest but to those who understand values such as self-sacrifice, love and forgiveness, this is where discipleship begins.

Saint Cecilia - November 22nd - The power of music in Christian worship is obvious.



Music can have many qualities - spiritual, emotional, theological, intellectual. We may respond in a variety of ways. Militant songs stir our spirits; quiet songs make us reflective; joyful songs cheer us up and so on. But most importantly our hymns are not intended as some kind of entertainment, but as an integral part of the liturgy. When churchgoers sit back and observe performances, then they are reduced to being consumers instead of participants. On this the feast of St Cecilia, patron saint of music, we are asked to emulate her example. Like any good Christian, Cecilia sang in her heart, and sometimes with her voice. She has become a symbol of the Church's conviction that good music is an integral part of the liturgy, of greater value to the Church than any other art.

Schools Consultation Paper - You may be aware that in early September, the Government launched its consultation "Schools that work for everyone." Part of this consultation contains the proposal to remove the current cap on faith based-admissions in schools. At the moment this cap has meant that the Catholic Bishops Conference has been unable build new Catholic schools, because it could result in the refusal of Catholic children to a Catholic school whilst non-Catholics could be admitted. This is contrary to Canon Law. The Catholic Education Service, on behalf of the Catholic Bishops has fought hard for the removal of the cap, and the Government's proposal to remove it is a huge step forward for Catholic education. The Catholic Education Service (CES) has asked all dioceses to encourage all schools and all individuals that support Catholic education to respond positively to the proposal to remove the cap on faith admissions to schools. This is particularly important, since it is anticipated that humanist and secular organisations will also be encouraging their supporters to oppose the removal. The CES have stressed that you do not have to answer all of the questions in the consultation document and can focus on particular sections. The consultation ends on 12th December 2016.
