Preparation for the Sacraments

Six teenagers have now formed a group to think about Confirmation : they intend meeting once a month, on first Fridays, with a view to a Confirmation taking place here hopefully in early Summer next year. The next meeting will be on the first Friday of September. If there are any more teenagers interested (they must be fifteen or over next year) please will they tell Fr.John. Meanwhile, our First Holy Communion Catechists will be forming a new group in September to begin preparation for First Holy Communion next Summer. If you would like your child to be prepared (he or she must be eight by the time the First Holy Communions take place) then please ask Fr.John for a registration form. This form must be completed before a child begins the course.

Red Missionary boxes Donal Hannon writes 'Now that the red boxes have been emptied, and their contents counted and banked, I'm very pleased to report that a total of £616.00 has been given. One or two new people have taken boxes, and I hope that maybe there will be more following Deacon Chris's talks this weekend.'

I BELIEVE.....

It is significant that in the Creed, that summary of the principal doctrines of the Catholic Faith which we recite at Mass on Sundays, and on the greater holy days, we say 'I believe'. 'I believe in one God', 'I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ', 'I believe in the Holy Spirit' and 'I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church'. We don't say 'I know', because we can't 'know' these great truths of the Faith in the way that we 'know' – without a possibility of doubt – those things which we know by our senses. We can't say 'I know' that there is a God in the same way that we say 'I know' that I am seeing and touching the tree on my front lawn. As regards the great truths of our religion, there is always the element of faith, of trusting, of affirming that which cannot be known through the senses.

But note that whilst we don't - can't – say 'I know', neither do we say 'I think'. 'I believe' is something much more definite and more substantial than 'I think'. When we say 'I believe' we are saying that we hold something to be true for very good reasons. We are saying that we have solid grounds for making our assertion. And yes, we Christians hold that the doctrines of the Faith which we profess are much much more than mere speculations. We might speak about the reliability of the Apostolic witness to the resurrection of the Lord, and about the more-than human powers and wisdom which he displayed. We might speak about the witness of the Church down the ages, and the ability of these truths to transform people's lives. We might speak about our own spiritual experience – and that of so many others – of a Christ who we feel to be present with us, and a Holy Spirit who is empowering us and directing us.

'I believe'. A weighty, significant statement. The assertion of a faith that so much more than mere fancy or speculation. 'I believe' for very good and solid reasons.....
