GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Treasure Is Where Your Heart Is - We all know those people who are so crippled inside that they seem incapable of bringing a fair or rational perspective to a situation. Perhaps we are one of those people ourselves but totally fail to see it? Perhaps we are all crippled inside to lesser or greater degrees but would strongly argue it, bringing to bear all those flawed arguments we have stored in our hearts for as long as we can remember.

Our hearts are where our treasure is stored. If we have good heart our words and actions will be good. It follows if our hearts are flawed our treasure will be flawed too, and our thoughts and actions will be misguided.

So how should we care for our hearts? Just as in our physical diet, we get out what we put in. If we live on a diet of pulp fiction, pulp fiction is all we will know. If we listen only to those with selfish agendas, greedy and selfish motives are all we will know. If we do only what is comfortable and safe, 'comfortable and safe' is all we will ever know. It is more than easy to become egocentric without ever seeing it coming. To those closest to us, our faults will be screamingly obvious. Sadly, we will be the last to see what other people see.

Today's gospel is an invitation to start challenging the views that blind us to the possibility of becoming better and more productive people. Do we complain or gossip too often? Do we fail to forgive and forget? Do we hold views about groups of people of whom we know nothing at all? Do we spend too much time working and too little time with those we love? Do we have very set or narrow views on religion, politics, money, or society as a whole?

It is hard to change our beliefs, especially if we don't even recognise them as 'planks'. A good starting point might be to open our eyes to someone we hugely admire and model our thinking on theirs. What starts off as an exercise could quickly become a life changing habit.

Ash Wednesday, 2nd March 2022 - 'Ash Wednesday is the start of Lent when we are invited



for forty days to set aside more time for prayer and fasting in preparation for Easter. The Ashes, made in the sign of the cross on our foreheads on this day, are an outward sign of our inward sorrow for our sins and of our commitment to Jesus as Our Lord and Saviour.'

Fasting and Abstinence: Keep your meals small and simple during Lent. This is not a slimming exercise. The thinking behind fasting and abstinence is that we strengthen our spiritual life by weakening physical pleasures. Fasting means reducing the amount of food that we would normally eat. Abstinence means not eating a particular food (meat). **Ash**

Wednesday and Good Friday are to be observed as special days of Fasting and Abstinence.

Lent activities: Without a resident Priest, we are limited in what we can do - Yes, we can put out different Stations of the cross for individuals to use, and replace after use, but after such a long period without the usual meetings of SVP, UCM etc, it does not seem logical nor likely to be productive. I shall put out a clip board to gauge interest in doing a CaFE programme during an evening during the week, "The Joy of Hope," something I have run in Wayland Prison, which the guys enjoyed. Heavenly revelation from John on the Holy Island of Patmos. Each of the four sessions (approx. 23 mins each) are presented at key places around the island by David Payne.

Women's Word Day of Prayer, 4th March 2022 - This years' service is presented by the World Day of Prayer organisation for England, Wales and Northern Ireland, with a theme of **'I know the plans I have for you'.** This is an invitation for women across the world to think about God's plans and how women can fit into those plans in a way they might not have done in days gone by.
