Do Not Fear, Only Believe

Most of us struggle to make the most of our lives and often not as successfully as we would like. We worry about finding the right partner, we worry about our children, we worry about illness and we worry about money. We have learned from an early age that it isn't life itself that is important but how we fill our lives. But even having realised this every important fact, we still strive to live longer lives rather than better lives. When we read how Jesus cured and even brought people back from the

dead, we notice one very important similarity, Jesus doesn't just add years to people's lives he changes lives. He doesn't change their lives in the way winning the lottery might change one's life. He doesn't grant a fairy tale happy ending with the wave of a magic wand, rather he makes his subjects whole and complete and ready to live life with a new outlook. Both the woman and the family in today's story must have felt that life had slipped through their fingers. The woman who had suffered haemorrhaging for twelve years had reached the depths of despair. Jesus was her last and only hope. The young girl seemed beyond any help; she had already been declared dead. Jesus gave them both their lives back. Is it likely that they would have gone on living exactly as before? Probably not! There's nothing like a second chance, especially at death's door to make us re-evaluate.

The gospel call to change our lives is part and parcel of the call to faith, a faith in a God who saves lives and changes lives. Whether it be the very public faith shown today by Jairus the synagogue leader, or the very private display of faith shown by the destitute woman who touched Jesus' cloak, faith and how we make the best of life goes hand in hand. Today Jesus tells us not to fear, but only to believe.

Mass Times this Week – Please note the changes to Mass times this week. There are Masses on Tuesday at 10.00am and 7.30pm for the Solemnity of St Peter & St Paul and there is no Mass on Wednesday.

Parish Safeguarding Matters: As parish life begins to get back to 'normal' over the coming months, it is important that everyone is reminded of safeguarding matters regarding children, young people and vulnerable adults. Anyone who does voluntary work with children, young people and/or vulnerable adults is required to have a DBS check to certify that they are allowed to undertake this work - anyone taking on a voluntary role of this nature must contact me to apply for the DBS & diocesan application. This is for the protection of the volunteers as well as the people they are helping. In our parish this usually, but not exclusively includes, Catechists, Eucharistic Ministers taking the Blesses Sacrament to the sick at home, members of the UCM involved in welfare, Senior Altar Servers, and the SVP. The DBS check and diocesan procedures require volunteers to complete a few forms **before** the voluntary work is undertaken and this certification is

updated & re-checked approximately every 3 years. Due to the pandemic restrictions, many of the re-checks are now overdue and so if you already have a DBS check for our parish, I am likely to contact you soon to complete a re-check if one is due. I will display a code of conduct for all who work with children, young people and vulnerable adults at the back of church along with a leaflet that explains what to do if you are concerned about a child or adult at risk in our parish. There are some spare copies of the leaflet at the back of church; all volunteers especially should have one of these, so do please take one.
