### **The Spiritual Diet**

The uncanny thing about being out of shape is that none of us consciously allow ourselves to become that way; it's something that creeps up on us. The extra pounds that pile on around our waistlines are the result of making wrong choices on a daily basis. Just as we can become physically unfit so we can become spiritually unfit. None of us make bad choices on purpose, but nonetheless if we make choices on a daily basis that are not based on God's values we can easily feel weighed down, dissatisfied and unhappy.

The feeding of the five thousand is prophetic. Jesus is showing us that God's reign is about satisfying both human spiritual and physical need. The importance of the miracle is not so much about the multiplication of food, but the message that God can provide for all our needs. On the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we are reminded that in just the same way as we care for our physical diet, we need to make Jesus part of our spiritual diet both in communion and in our daily choices to live as Christians so that we might be spiritually whole. We are invited to feel alive and rejuvenated and ready to impact the world around us.

Jesus was all about sharing. He gave his time, his love and finally his body and blood. When we receive Holy Communion in Mass our action is twofold. The Eucharist is a banquet for the multitudes in which we remember Jesus' sacrificial self-giving. More than this, we remember the promise that anyone who eats his bread and drinks his blood will share eternal life.

Letter from our Rome Correspondent – "Hard though it is to believe, this is already my last communication to you for the current academic year, as we students in Rome begin our final few weeks of the second semester before we head off to our home dioceses for summer placements and some holiday time. So yes, that means that I hope to see all of you sometime soon, or at least before we return here in mid-September! The next few weeks are not to be quiet and restful, however – we are finishing with lectures this week, but afterwards have ten days of examinations, and a number of special liturgies and events to manage before the ordination of third year students as deacons on June 15<sup>th</sup>. The responsibility for running the house in terms of work in the sacristy, refectory and administrative departments has now been turned over to us first years by our seniors, as is traditional in late May, and so much of the organisation of these occasions will now be in our hands.

"I mentioned in my last note to you that on May 11<sup>th</sup> we were to be instituted as lectors as the first formal step in our preparation for ministry; it was a wonderful and very moving service, as we were pledged to proclaim the word of God in scripture within whatever places we find ourselves in the worldwide Church. This represents an office and responsibility in the liturgy that must be granted before the candidate can proceed to the next stage of formation for the priesthood, and is given only once, and is formally recorded at the diocese and the curia as per the requirements of Church law. Although the ritual is simple and took place within the context of a weekday mass, I found myself very struck by the progression that has taken place in this last year for me and my fellow seminarians. If things go according to plan, another three years will elapse before I am considered for priestly ordination, and that seems like a comfortably long time away to allow for further reflection; but then again, it was three years ago that I began my discernment of pursuing this vocation, and that seems like only yesterday.

"Once again I humbly ask for your prayers and wish to express my appreciation for your ongoing support over this last year. I can now say with greater certainty that soon I should be able to thank you all in person. Until then, my best wishes and deepest gratitude. - In Christ, Mike Brookes."
